## ■ **Getting Started: Integration with Alexa Devices**

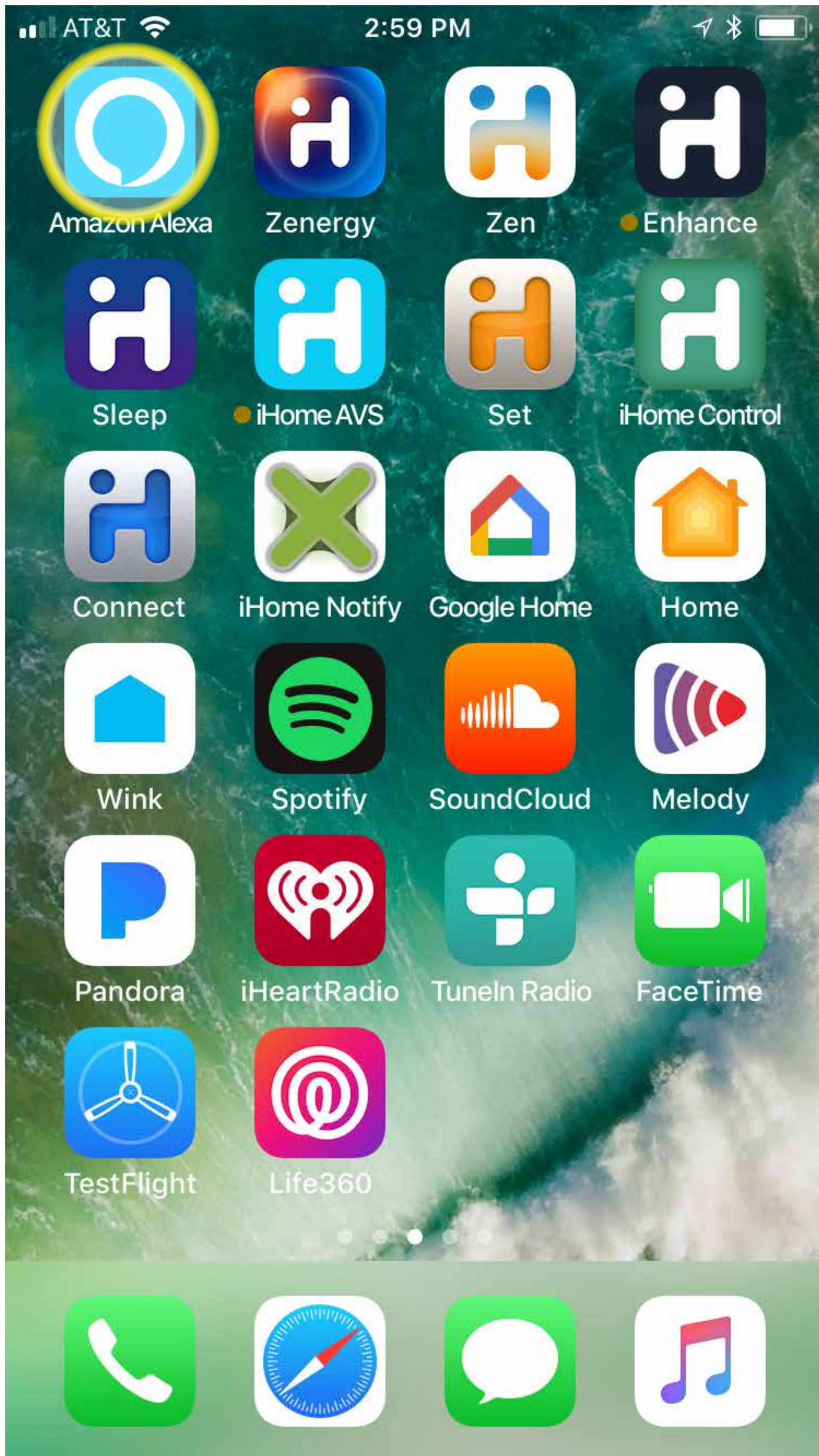
1. Make sure that you have already created an iHome account in your iHome Control app and that your SmartPlug(s) are connected to WiFi and operational.
2. Make sure that your Amazon Device (e.g. Echo, Dot, Tap) is set up and connected to Wi-Fi before proceeding with the next step.



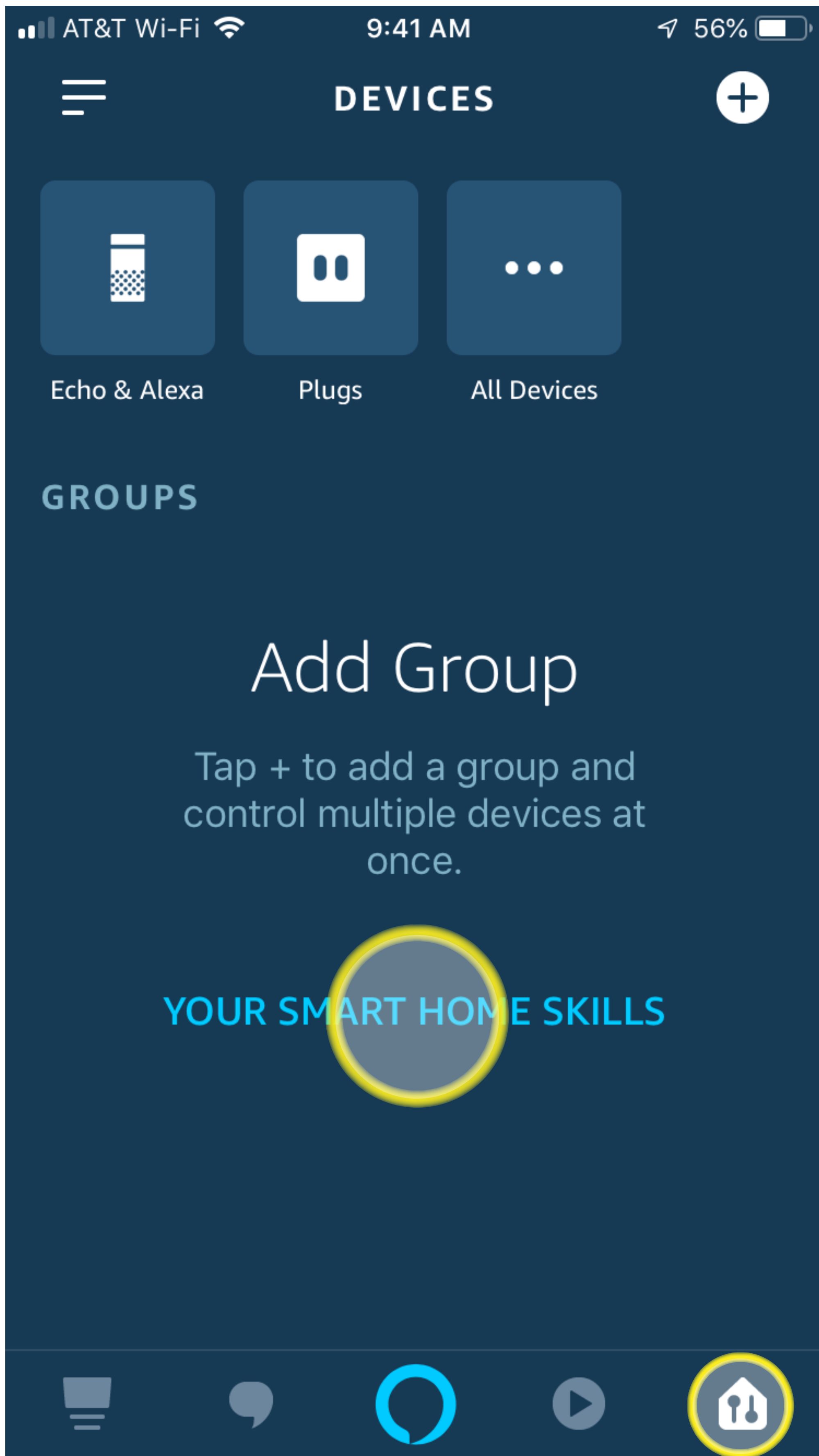
# ALEXA INTEGRATION

## STEP 1


- Open your Amazon Alexa App







## STEP 2

- In the Alexa app, go to devices . Select “Your Smart Home Skills”

## STEP 3

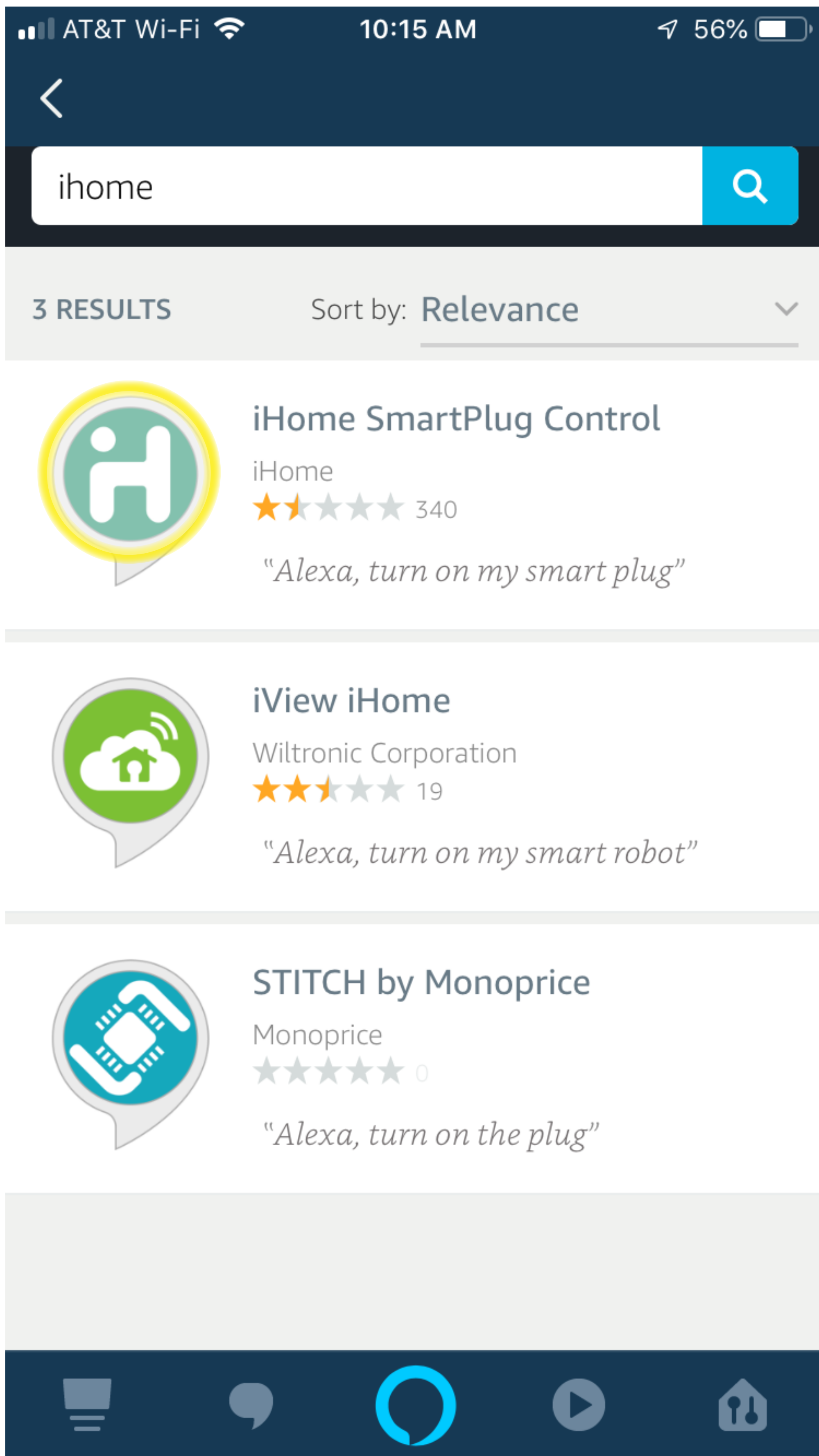
- Select “Enable Smart Home Skills”

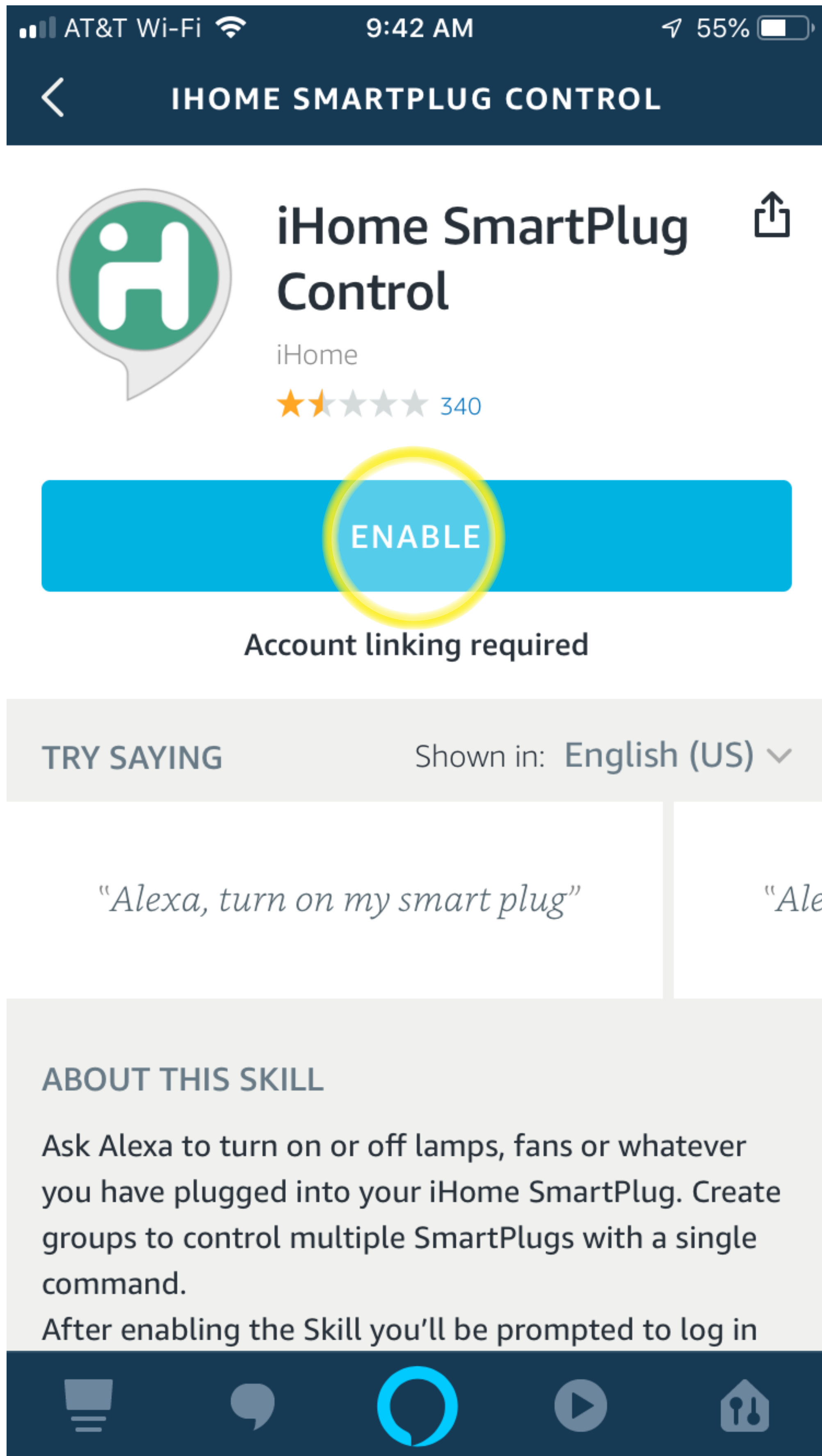
## STEP 4

- Search for “iHome”
- Select “iHome SmartPlug Control” from the search results



## STEP 5

Select "Enable"

- Enter your iHome login credentials (same account used in iHome Control app)
- Select “Login”

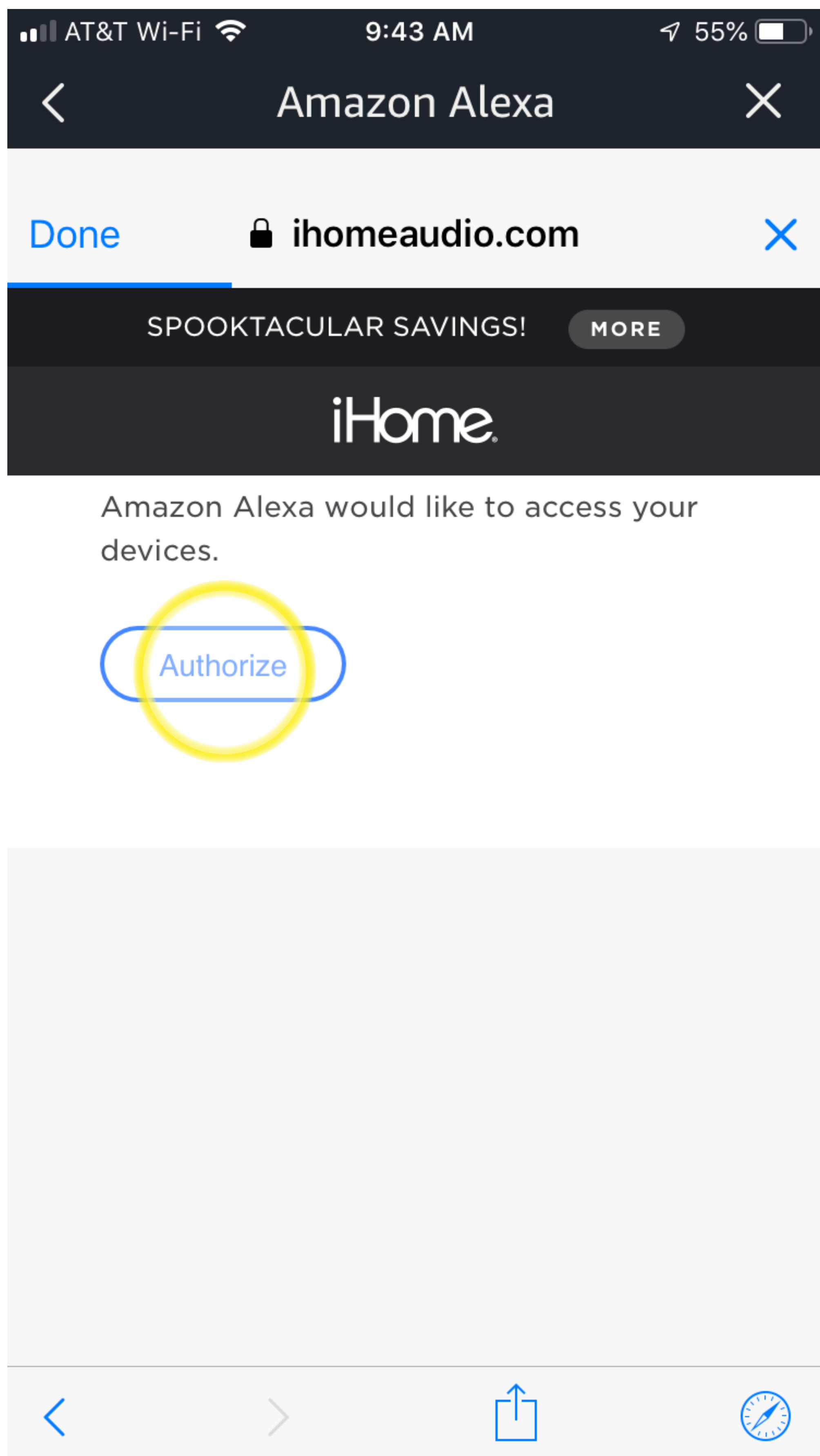

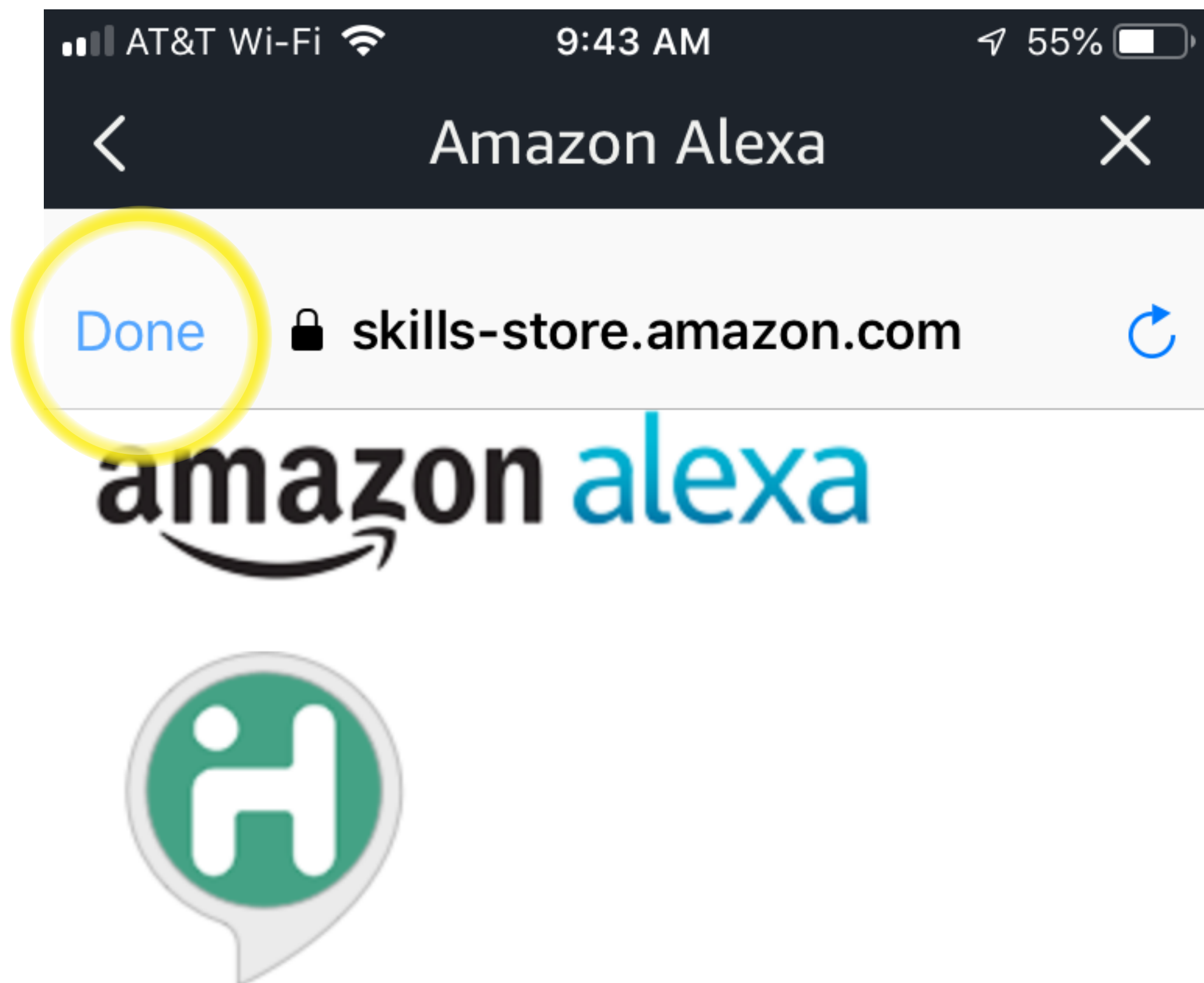

## STEP 8

- You will see the message “iHome SmartPlug Control has been successfully linked”
- Tap Done to close this window.

What to do next:

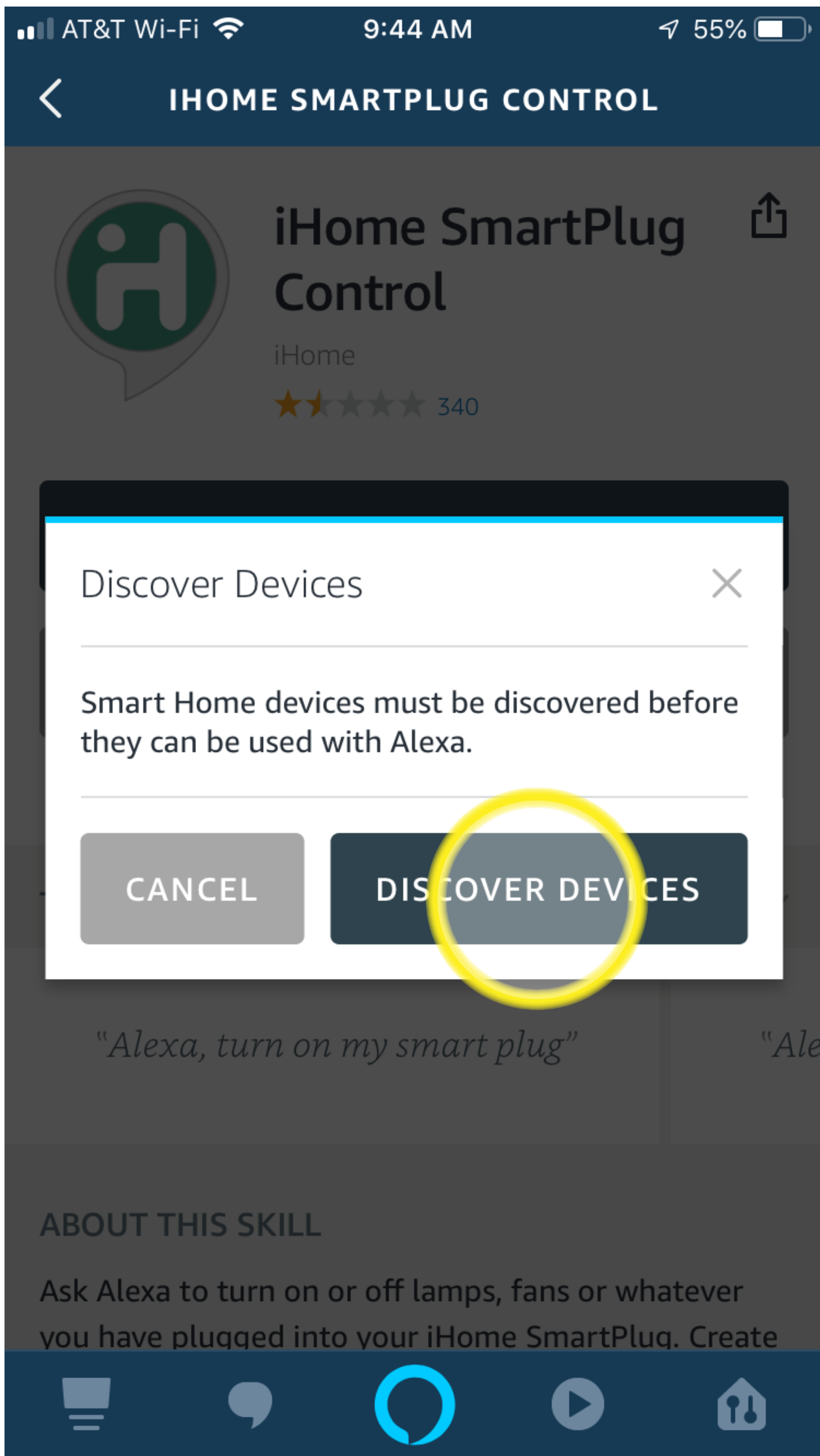
→ Close this window to discover smart-home devices you can control with Alexa.



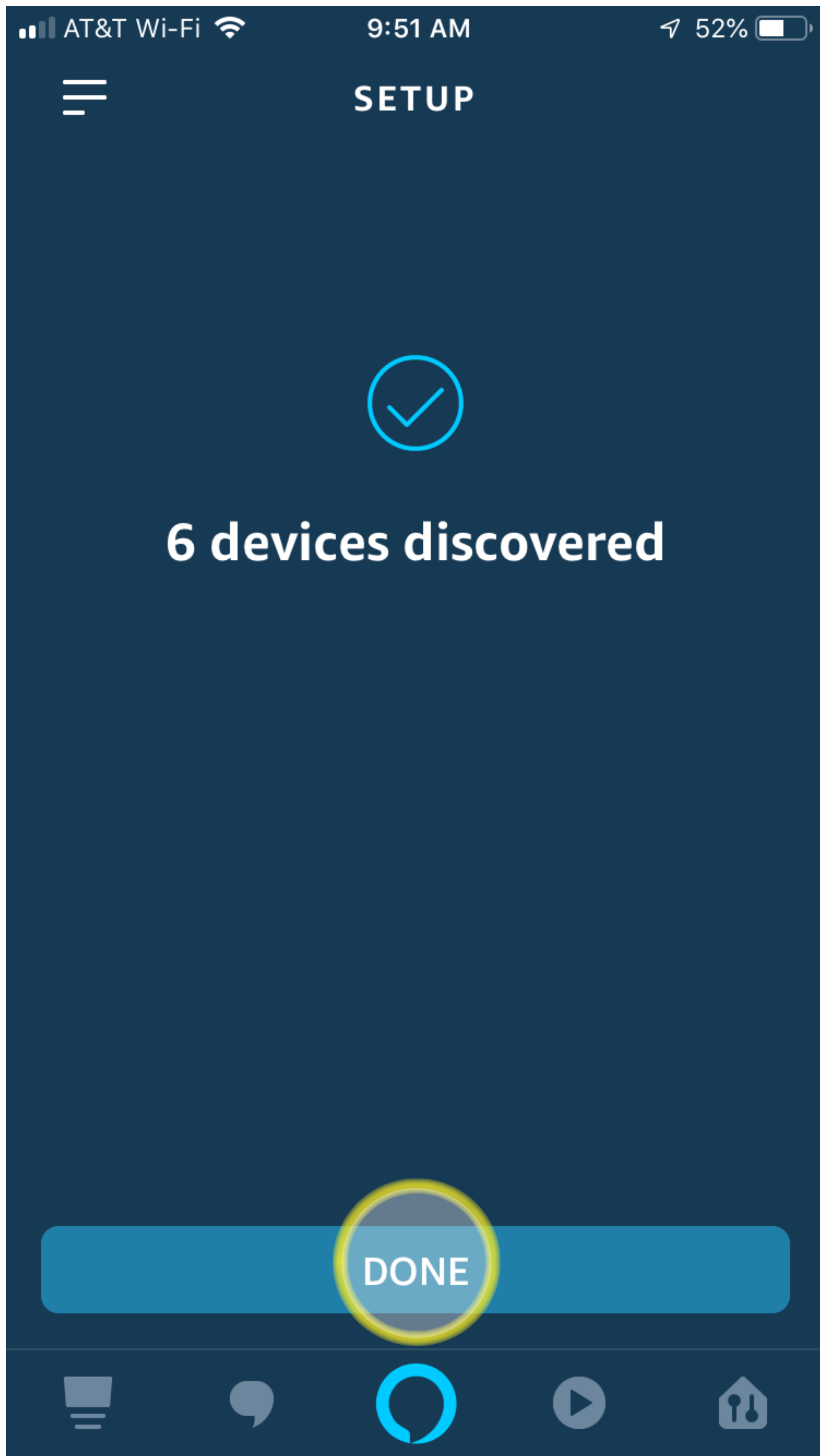
# ALEXA INTEGRATION

## STEP 9

- Select “Discover Devices”

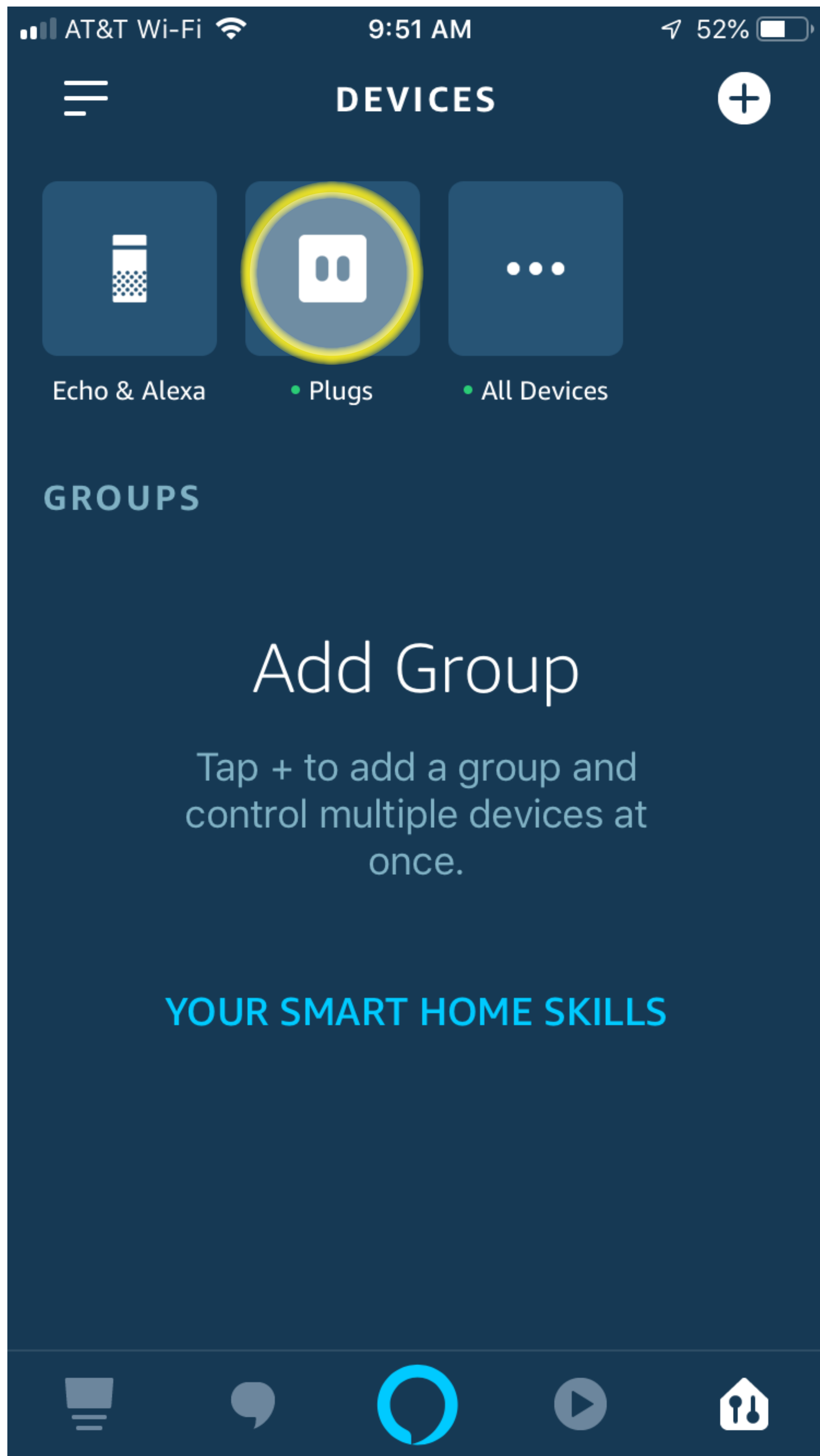






## STEP 10

- Alexa displays the number of devices discovered.
- Select “Done.”

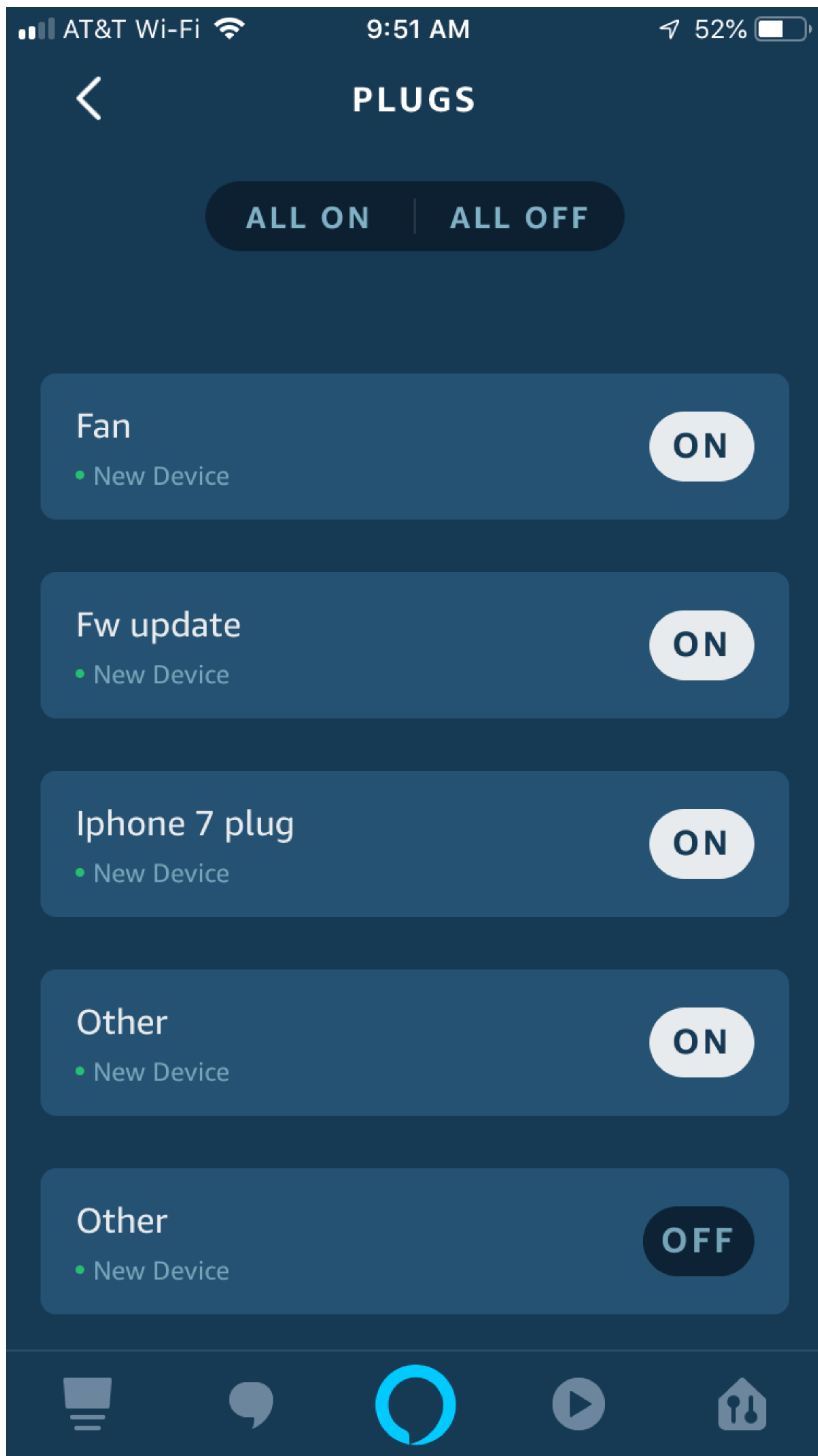


## STEP 11

- Select “Plugs” to view a list of all your iHome SmartPlug devices.

## STEP 12

- You should now be able to control your SmartPlug(s) by telling Alexa to turn your device name ON or OFF.





**NOTE:**

You can also group devices together and create a different group name that Alexa can control with a single voice command.

**NOTE ON GROUPS:**

If Alexa has difficulty understanding your device name(s), or if you want to control multiple devices with a single command we recommend setting up a new “Group” within your Alexa app. Groups can have a single device, or multiple, and you will be able to create a new name for the Group.
